
BURLINGTON TOWN

Welcome to the Executive City Profile for Burlington town. In this document you will find Demographic, Economic, and Housing data from the U.S. Census Bureau. This document uses data from the 2010 U.S. Census, the 2010 Five-Year American Community Survey (ACS), and the most recent 2019 Five-Year ACS to explore local trends in the population, economy, and housing market of Burlington town.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Population

Census population estimates from 2000 to 2020 are displayed below and indicate that the population of Burlington town increased by 19.1 percent from 288 persons in 2010 to 343 persons in 2020.




Population By Race And Ethnicity

In Burlington town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the White racial population represented the largest share of the total population, accounting for 91.3 percent of the total population, or 263 people. By 2019, the White population had decreased by 4.9 percentage points and accounted for 86.4 percent of the total population. In Burlington town, according to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of population by race was still the White population, accounting for 86.4 percent of the total population in 2019, or 222 persons. The fastest growing racial population in Burlington town was the Two or More Races population, which increased by 5.6 percent from 1.4 percent of the total population in 2010 to 7.0 percent in 2019.


Hispanic Population


Population By Age

In Burlington town, according to the 2010 Census, the 5 to 19 age cohort represented the largest share of the total population, accounting for 32.3 percent of the total population, or 93 people. By 2019, the 5 to 19 population had decreased by 3.9 percentage points and accounted for 28.4 percent of the total population. In Burlington town, according to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of population by age was the 35 to 54 population, accounting for 35.0 percent of the total population in 2019, or 90 persons. The fastest growing age cohort in Burlington town was the 35 to 54 population, which increased by 15.2 percent from 19.8 percent of the total population in 2010 to 35.0 percent in 2019.


Elderly Population By Age

The elderly population is further explored below. In 2019 those aged 65 to 66 accounted for 15.8 percent of the elderly population, while those aged 67 to 69 accounted for an additional 10.5 percent. The oldest cohort in Burlington town, those aged 85 and older, accounted for 0 percent of the elderly population in 2019.


Disability By Age

The disability rate for females was 6.3 percent in 2019, compared to 12.3 percent for males. The disability rate tends to grow precipitously higher with age, with 100 percent of those over 75 experiencing a disability in 2019. Overall, the disability rate in Burlington town was 9.7 in 2019.






Poverty By Age

In 2019, an estimated 5.8 percent of the population in Burlington town, or 15 people, were living in poverty, compared to 15.1 percent living in poverty in 2000. In 2019, some 26.3 percent of those in poverty were under age 6 and 0 percent were 65 or older. This compares to an overall statewide poverty rate of 9.9 percent and a nationwide poverty rate of 12.3 percent.




Educational Attainment

In 2019, 90.2 percent of households had a high school education or greater, including 36.2 percent with a high school diploma or equivalent, 33.3 percent with some college, 14.9 percent with a Bachelor Degree, and 5.7 percent with a graduate or professional degree. In comparison, in 2010, 25.7 percent of households in Burlington town had less than a high school education, while 34.2 percent had a high school diploma or equivalent and 5.3 percent had a Bachelors Degree.






Employment By Industry




HOUSING

Housing Units By Type





Households By Income

In Burlington town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by income were those making \$50,000 to \$74,999, accounting for 28.4 percent of all households in 2010, or 21 households. In comparison, the smallest cohort of households by income in Burlington town in 2010 were those making \$20,000 to \$24,999, representing 0.0 percent of all households. Between 2010 and the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the share of households making \$50,000 to \$74,999 in Burlington town increased by 1.0 percentage points and accounted for 29.4 percent of all households in 2019. According to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by income in Burlington town was still the \$50,000 to \$74,999 cohort, accounting for 29.4 percent of the total households in 2019, or 25 households. The fastest growing cohort of households by income between 2010 and 2019 was those making \$100,000 or More, which increased by 27.1 percent from 0.0 percent of all households in 2010 to 27.1 percent in 2019.


Households By Household Size



Households By Year Home Built

In Burlington town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by year built were those built in 1939 or Earlier, accounting for 44.6 percent of all households in 2010, or 33 households. In comparison, the smallest cohort of households by year built in Burlington town in 2010 were those built in 1950 to 1959, representing 0.0 percent of all households. Between 2010 and the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the share of households built in 1939 or Earlier in Burlington town decreased by 38.7 percentage points and accounted for 5.9 percent of all households in 2019. According to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by year built in Burlington town was the 1980 to 1989 cohort, accounting for 40.0 percent of the total households in 2019, or 34 households. The fastest growing cohort of households by year built between 2010 and 2019 was those built in 1980 to 1989, which increased by 27.8 percent from 12.2 percent of all households in 2010 to 40.0 percent in 2019.



Census Vacancy Rate

In 2019 the Owner-Occupied For Sale vacancy rate was 0.0% percent, while the Rental Unit vacancy rate was 0.0% percent in Burlington town.



Cost Burden - Total

In Burlington town, according to the 2010 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by presence of cost burden were those experiencing No Cost Burden, accounting for 52.7 percent of all households in 2010, or 39 households. In comparison, the smallest cohort of households by presence of cost burden in Burlington town in 2010 were those experiencing Severe Cost Burden, representing 9.5 percent of all households. Between 2010 and the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the share of households experiencing No Cost Burden in Burlington town increased by 28.5 percentage points and accounted for 81.2 percent of all households in 2019. According to the 2019 Five-Year ACS, the largest cohort of households by presence of cost burden in Burlington town was still the No Cost Burden cohort, accounting for 81.2 percent of the total households in 2019, or 69 households. The fastest growing cohort of households by presence of cost burden between 2010 and 2019 was those experiencing No Cost Burden, which increased by 28.5 percent from 52.7 percent of all households in 2010 to 81.2 percent in 2019.
